Multiple themes are explored, including enslavement, reconstruction, the racial segregation of public accommodations (including parks and schools), civil rights history, and commemoration. The digital guide aims to raise the visibility and value of these myriad sites, provoking further discussion and research. This simultaneously amplifies the contributions of African American designers and shapers who have significantly contributed to landscapes across the nation. The content is folded into TCLF’s *What’s Out There* database. Each entry includes a description of the site’s design history, photographs, and an interactive map. With additional support, TCLF aspires to habitually expand this guide.
