The Landscape Architecture of Lawrence Halprin, a traveling photographic exhibition about the life and work of landscape architect Lawrence Halprin (1916-2009), was created in 2016 during the centennial anniversary of Halprin's birth. The exhibition features 56 commissioned photographs by leading landscape photographers of dozens of Halprin's major works, including residential projects created early in his career in the 1950s; the Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial in Washington, D.C.; capstone projects such as the Yosemite Falls approach and Stern Grove in San Francisco, CA.
